




Chance of a Freeze (< 32 degrees): Friday night/Saturday morning

Low Tide Levels



Below normal tide levels are expected early this week with low tide levels falling to around -2 feet relative to MLLW today and Tuesday at low tide times during the morning hours. Weak winds and then onshore flow will likely cause a return closer to normal late Wednesday and on Thursday.

Note: Tide levels are likely being predicted too low by the model by late Wednesday and on Thursday.

Weekly Forecast Highlights

- **We will see a hard freeze tonight, rural areas likely to fall into the teens with urban areas falling into the low to mid 20s. We should rise above freezing mid morning (around 10 am) Tuesday.**
- Another strong cold front will move into the area on Friday. There is a chance of rain on Friday with temperatures in the 40s. A freeze is likely by Saturday morning. **There is a chance of a hard freeze Saturday night/Sunday morning.**
- Below normal tides will continue today through Wednesday morning. As winds become easterly, tides will return closer to normal late Wednesday and Thursday, then fall below normal Friday night and continuing through the weekend with strong offshore flow behind the late week cold front.
